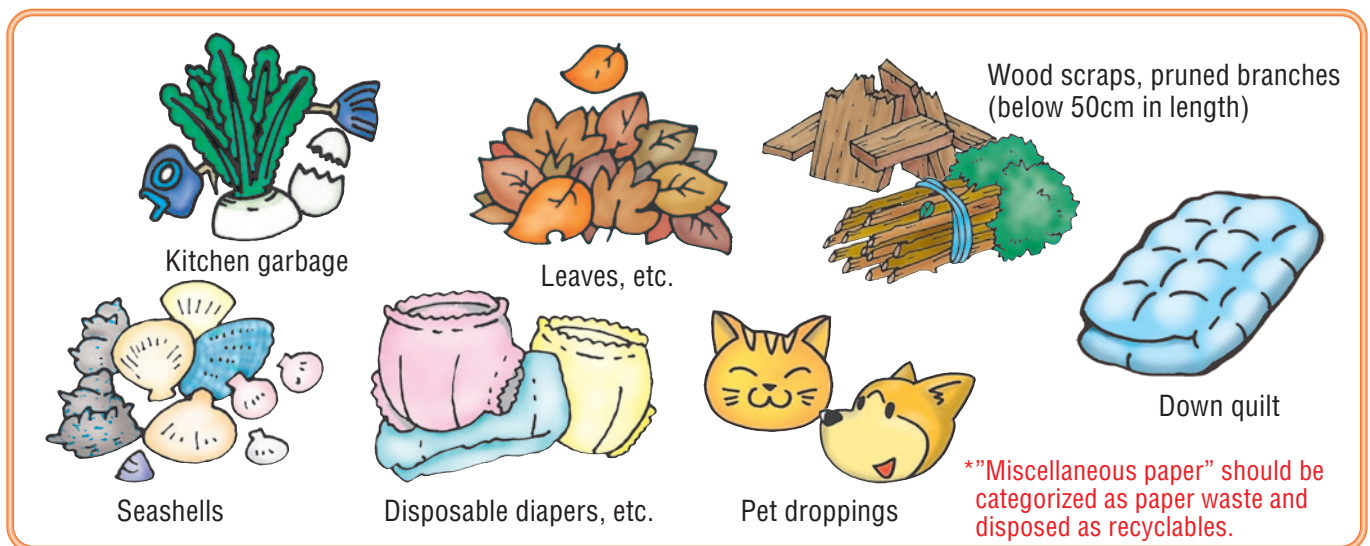

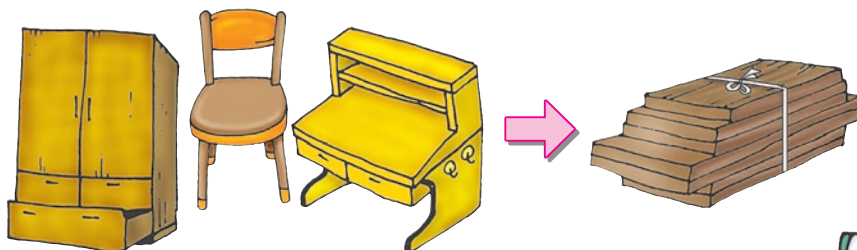
## Combustible Garbage <<Collected Twice a Week>>

<p><b>How to Sort</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>① Combustible items such as kitchen garbage, leaves, yard trimmings, seashells, disposable diapers, etc.</li> <li>② "Miscellaneous paper" is categorized as paper waste and should be disposed as recyclables.</li> <li>③ Metal parts should be removed when dismantling wooden furniture such as dressers, desks, and chairs.</li> <li>④ Feces should be disposed to the toilet from disposable diapers.</li> <li>⑤ Dirt should be removed from the roots of grass, flowers, etc.</li> </ol>
<p><b>How to Dispose</b></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>① Write your ward, section, and name on a town-designated garbage bag and tie at top to close.</li> <li>② Up to five bags or five bundles of garbage may be disposed at once. Larger quantities should be dropped off in person at the incineration plant.</li> <li>③ Drain kitchen garbage of liquids.</li> <li>④ Tree branches, bamboo, wooden items such as drawers, etc. should be cut into pieces no larger than 50cm and bundled using paper/hemp strings or ropes, etc. Branches should be no larger than 10cm in diameter. * Pruned branches (see p.4). * Branches or sprigs with thorns, such as roses, should be placed in a bag.</li> <li>⑤ Skewers, toothpicks, and other items with pointed tips should be broken in half.</li> <li>⑥ Cooking oil should be congealed with an oil disposal formula or soaked up with paper. * Recycling cooking oil (see p.2).</li> <li>⑦ Plastic and metal pieces should be removed.</li> <li>⑧ Down quilt should be bundled using paper strings.</li> </ol>



### Items that must be dismantled prior to disposal

Cut dismantled parts into pieces no larger than 50cm and bundle together.



**Drop off at incineration plant if the item cannot be dismantled.**
